

Nexus Model for Project Management Office (PMO)

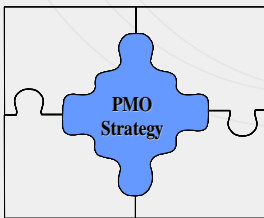

Improvement

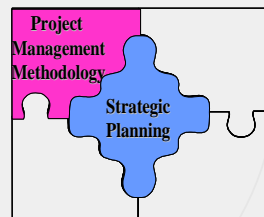


Nexus Model starts with the PMO strategy by assessing the current organization’s maturity and determining the future maturity as part of continuous improvement.

Project Management Methodology:

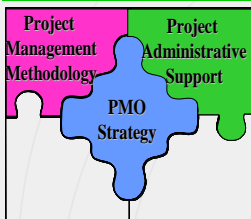
Process
